NEW BACHELOR OF NUTRITION SCIENCE

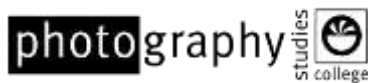
Nutritionists help communicate nutrition science to the public and advise the community about food choices for healthy eating. Studies in nutrition therefore include the nutritive value of foods, the nutrients that bodies need at different stages of development, and the role that nutrients and diet play in health promotion and disease prevention. Nutrition links very closely with the national health priorities in Australia such as obesity, diabetes, cardiovascular disease much of which are preventable through healthy lifestyle.

ACU's new 3-year **Bachelor of Nutrition Science** program will focus on general healthcare, chronic disease management, Indigenous health, and other emerging areas of need in the industry and will appeal to students interested in careers in nutrition including nutritionists in public and private industry, hospitals and public health sectors, e-health and tele-health, in nutrition communication, and in the food science and in the research and development sectors.

Importantly, the program will also provide the basis for postgraduate studies in dietetics. Dietitians treat disease through diet and therefore require further studies and clinical practice in health settings.

The VCE pre-requisites are: Units 3 and 4 – a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or 25 in any other English.

Australian National University (ANU) launched the **Tuckwell Scholarship Program** in 2013. Receiving a Tuckwell Scholarship – valued at over \$21,000 per year for the length of an undergraduate degree - is not just about a students' intellect. It is also about their desire and determination to use their natural abilities to realise their full potential so that they can make a difference in the world. All up, one could say, **this is no ordinary scholarship!**

Eligible students need to expect an ATAR of 95+ but students who have experienced disadvantage, or who have achieved significantly in other ways, may still be eligible. **Applications open on 6 March 2017 and close on 27 March 2017.**
