
The program is registered for the Child Care Benefit. All families attending the service are eligible for fee relief on registration with the Family Assistance Office (Centrelink). Further information is available from the Out of School Hours coordinator.

Public Holidays

There is no school on Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Queen's Birthday or Melbourne Cup Day. The Monday prior to Melbourne Cup Day is designated as a mid-term holiday.

Spare Clothing

The College has a supply of spare clothing available for students to wear in case of accidents.

Student Banking

Student banking operates each week for children wishing to participate. Enrolment forms are available from the Junior School Office. Parent volunteers administer this service, as part of their Family Contribution. The College receives a commission for each deposit made into children's school bank accounts.

Sun Smart Policy

When outdoors, all students are expected to wear a College sun hat available at the College Shop. During Terms 1 and 4 students will be asked to play in the shade. Use of a sunscreen and sunglasses are encouraged and these may be kept in the school bag.

Valuable Items

Please do not allow your child to bring valuable or treasured items to school. Much distress can be caused if these are lost or broken. Large amounts of money are not encouraged.

Visitors

Visitors, including parents who will be in the school to assist as part of their Family Contribution, are required to register at the front office where they will be issued with a visitors badge. This badge should be worn prominently and returned to the office on departure. Visitors not displaying their badge will be approached by staff and sent to the front office to register.

Walking School Bus

The College has been involved in the Walking School Bus for a number of years. This program, supported by VicHealth and the Brimbank Council, enables students to walk to and from school, supervised by adults, promoting a healthy and active way to start and end their school day. The Walking School Bus follows designated routes on particular days and is supervised by at least two parents, one of whom is the 'driver' and the other is the 'conductor', who have undergone Walking School Bus training, ensuring the safety of the students involved in the activity.

The Walking School Bus not only promotes a more active alternative to driving to and from school, but also is an enjoyable social activity for students, having the opportunity to chat to friends or make new friends while they walk to school. Parents have the opportunity to be involved in the Walking School Bus as drivers or conductors and receive 'hours' as part of their Family Contribution.
